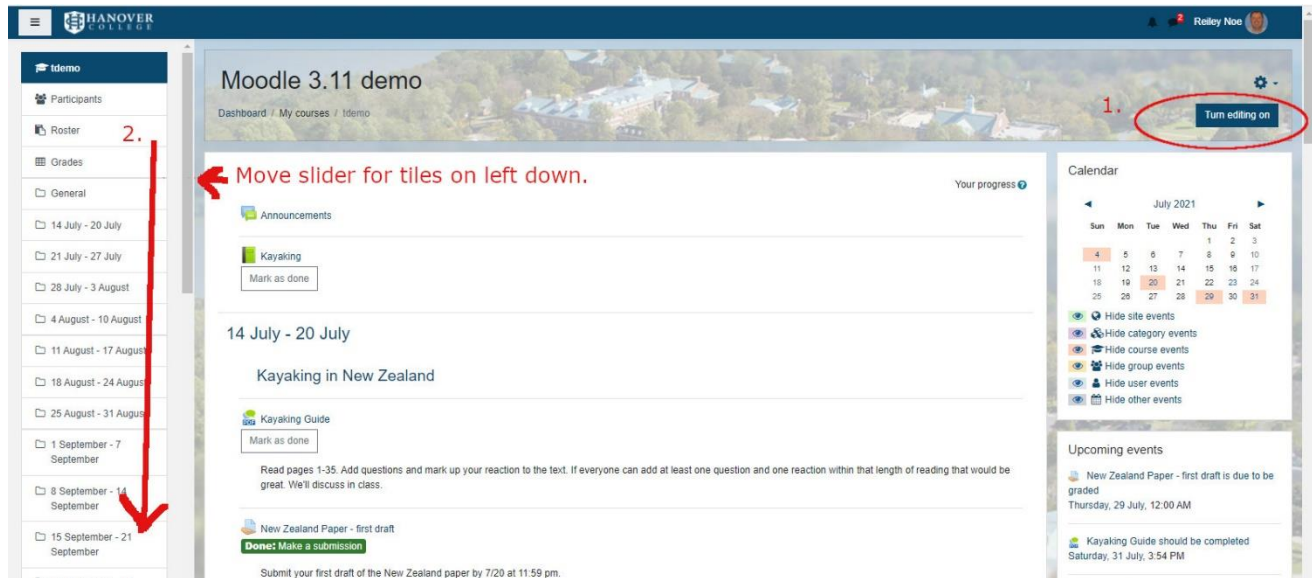


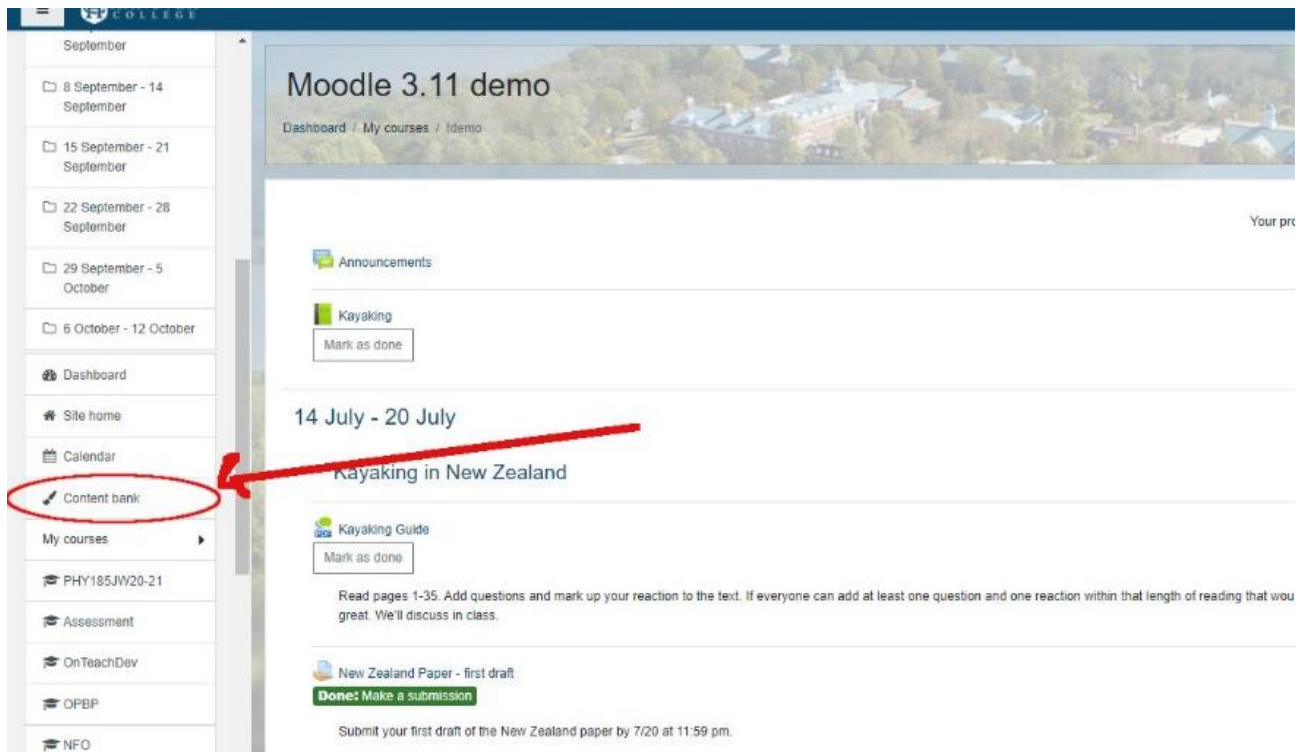
## Adding H5P Content to a Class from the Content Bank

You can add H5P activities from the Content bank. Here, we'll look at how to add content from the content bank to the class by looking at how to add a Timeline

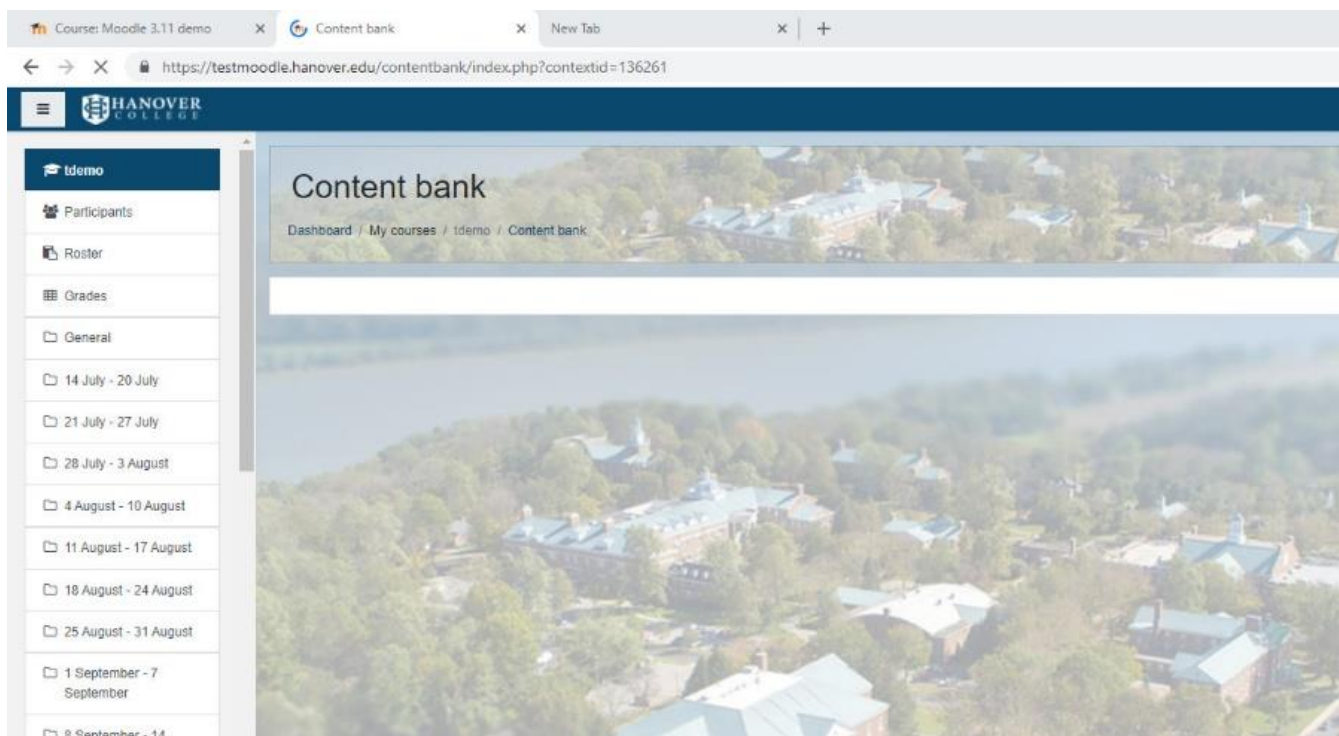
1. **Turn Editing On** and then scroll down the tiles – there is a slider to the right of the tiles.



2. Click on the **Content Bank** tile.

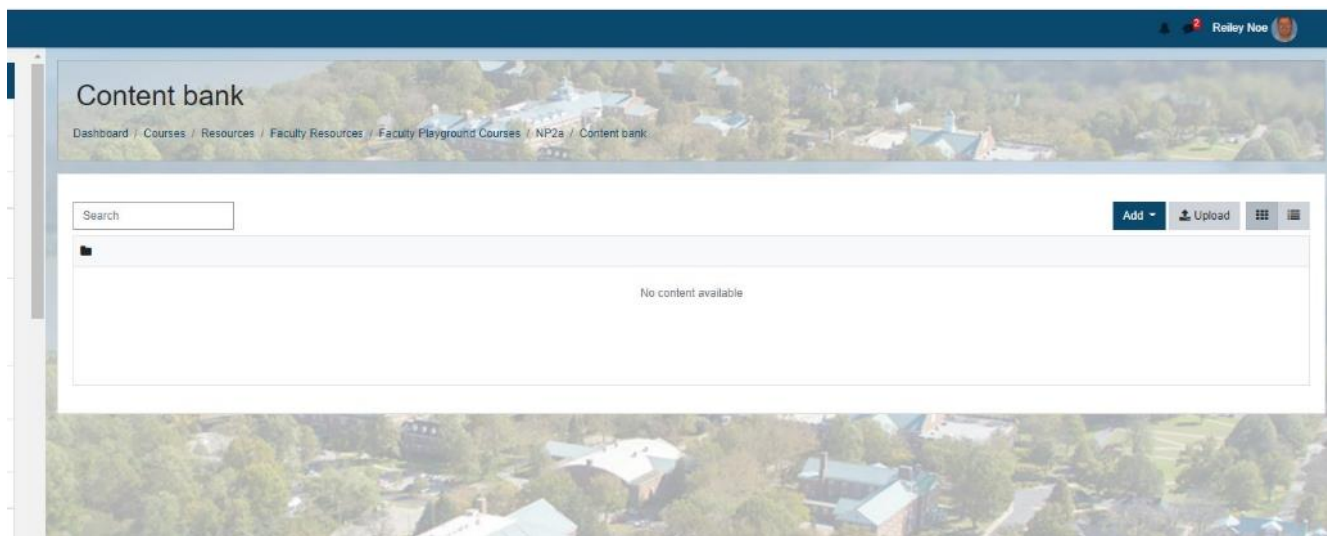


3. The **Content Bank** will take some time to load. Be patient. You'll see this screen for several seconds.

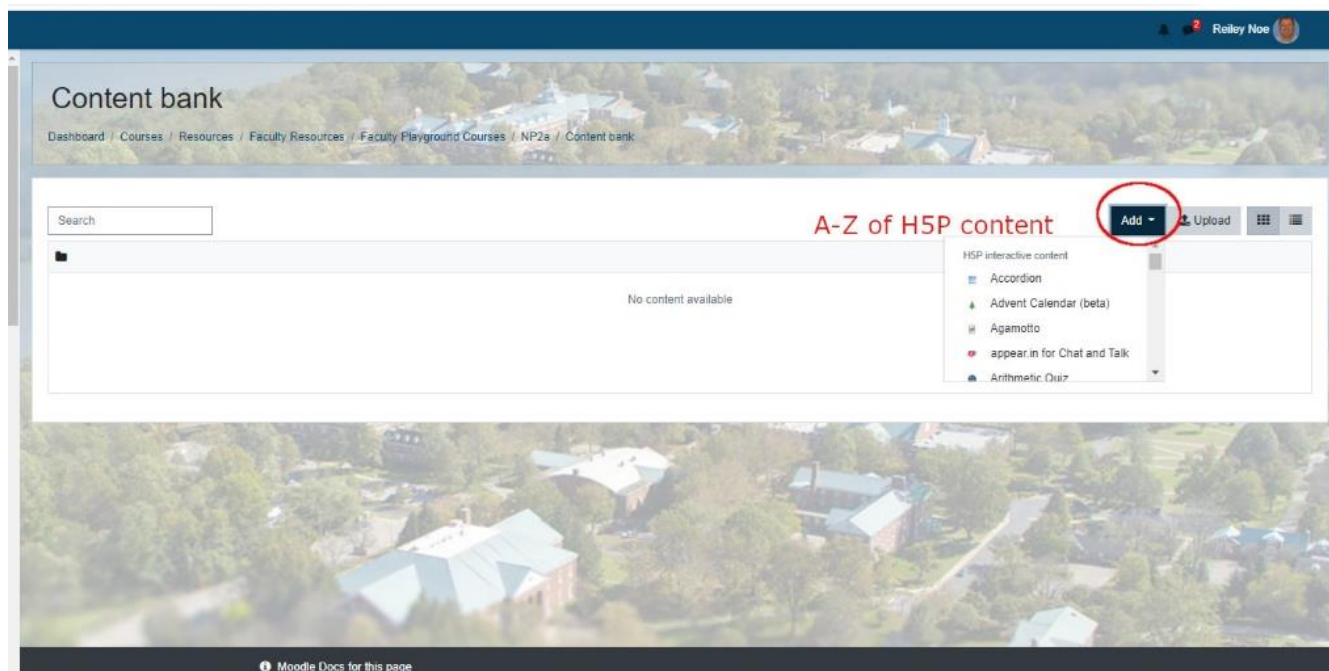


4. This is what the **Content Bank** will look like the first time you access this for a course. Please note that each course has a different **Content Bank**. If you made something in Course A, it will not show up in the Content Bank for Course B automatically – though you can move items between Content Banks.

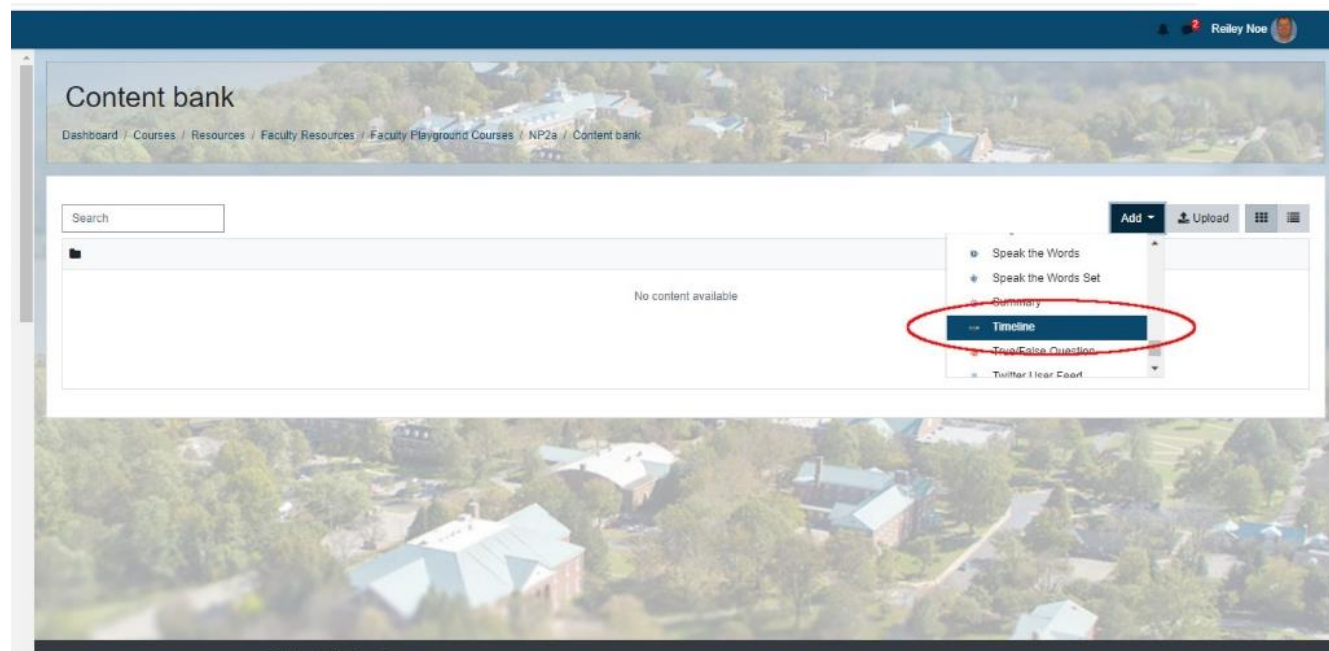
After you add content, it will be arranged horizontally in the screenshot below.




5. The **Add** button will give you an **A-Z listing** of all of the content types available as an H5P content item. You'll use the **Add** button to create H5P content within the **Content Bank**.



6. I will pick out **Timeline** as an example here. We'll make a timeline about the history of coffee.




7. The specifics of what you fill in will vary depending on the content type but fill in the fields. For the **Timeline**, you'll need to give it a title and headline and then give it a background image. For this one, I'll pick out dates to add along with titles.

8. Once you've finished everything, click **Save**.

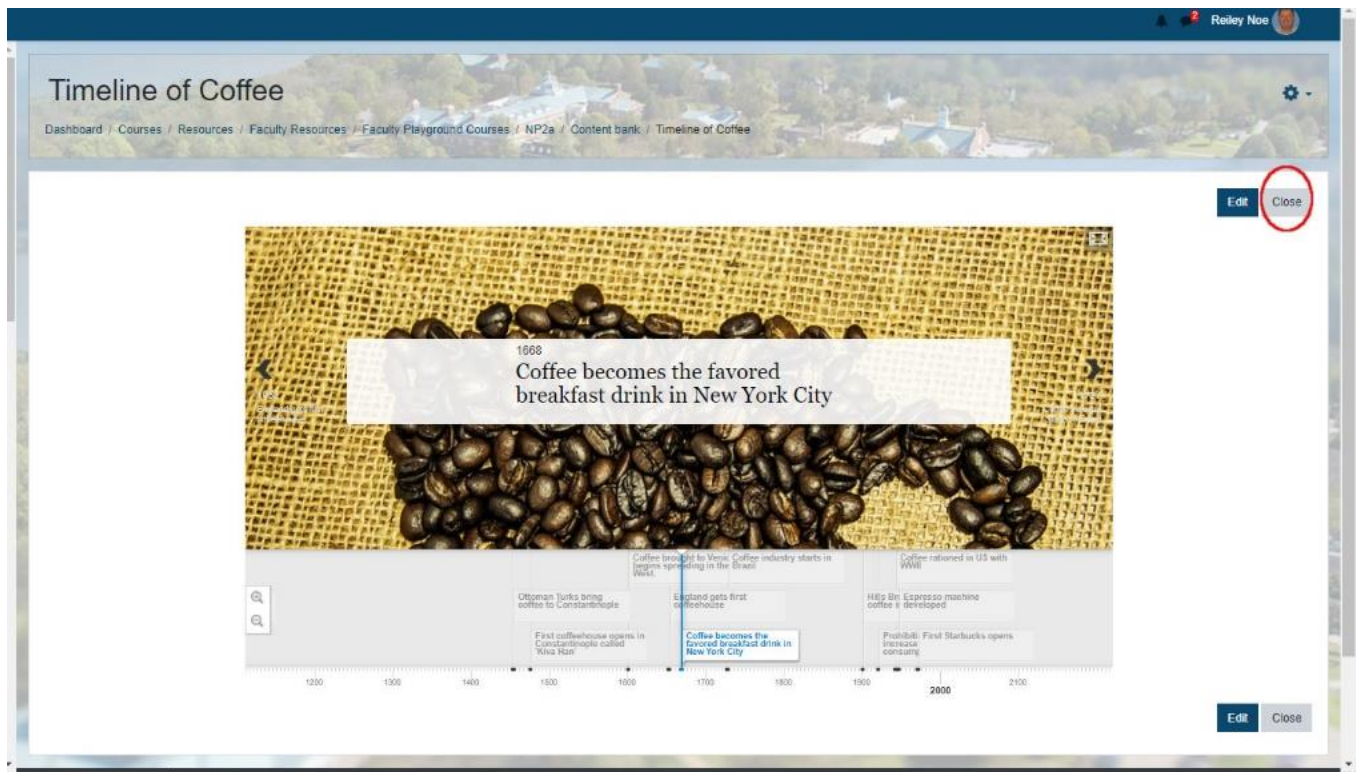

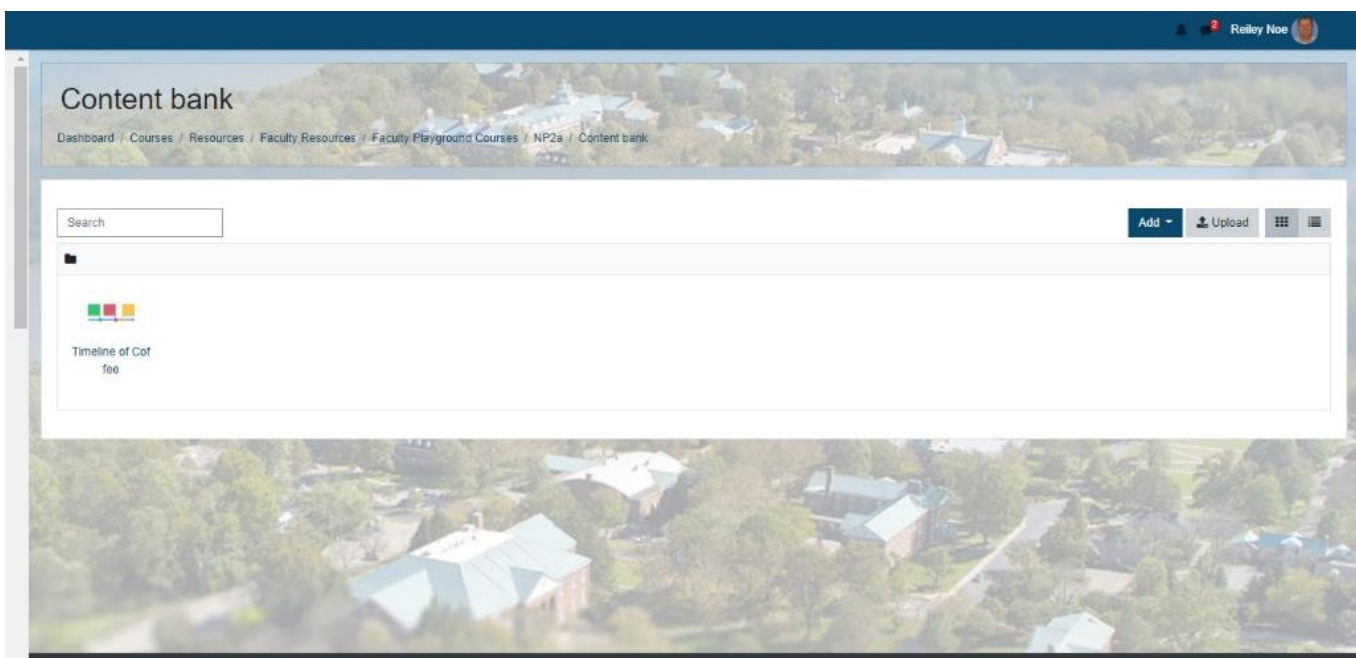

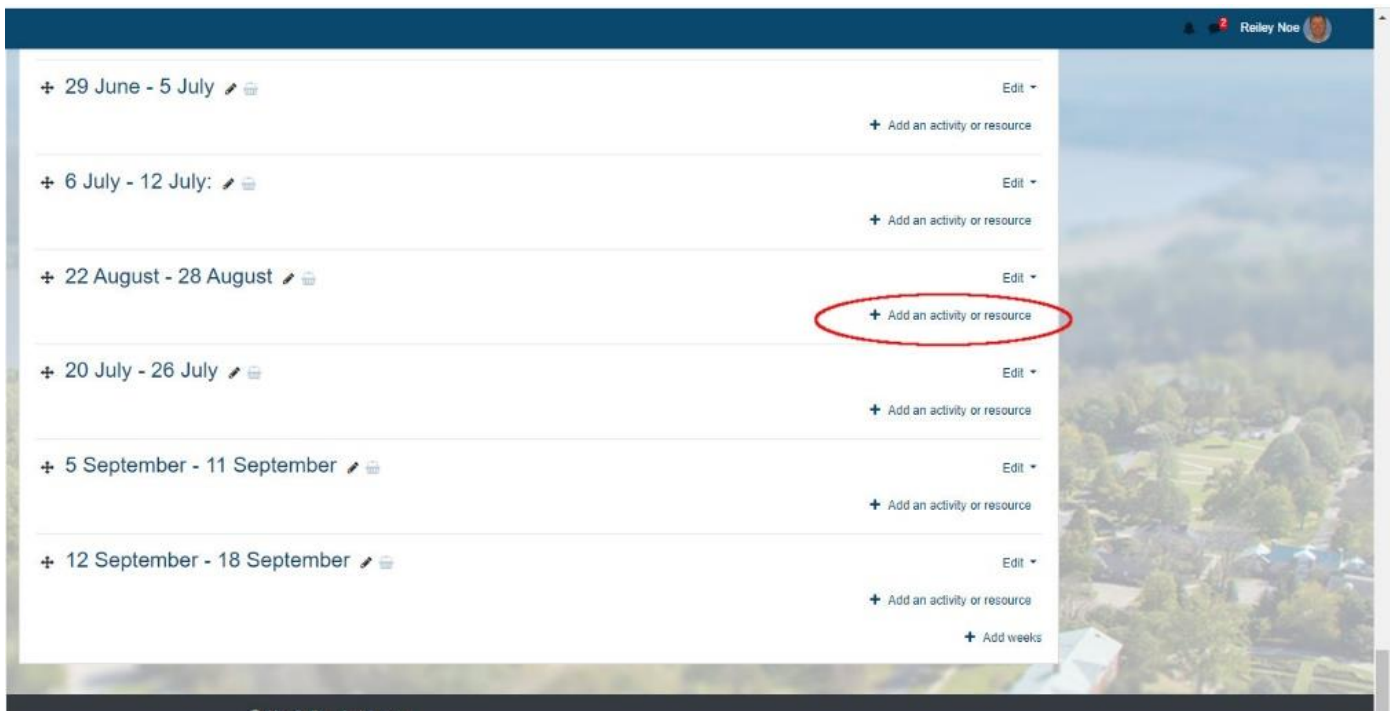
9. After you've saved when you create something in the **Content Bank**, you'll see a screen similar to what you see below – that particular content item along with an Edit button (where you can make changes to it) and a **Close** button where you can close it out.



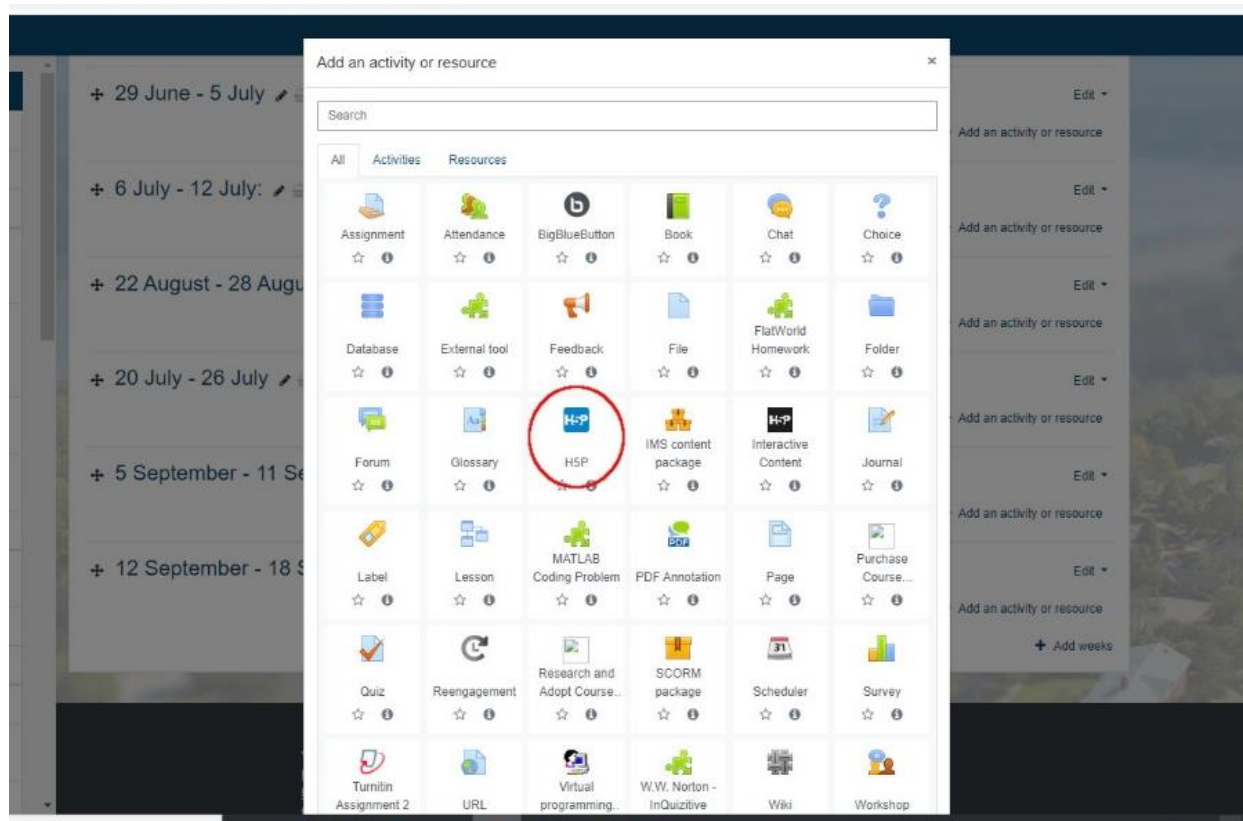
10. You'll see the H5P content item in the **Content Bank**.



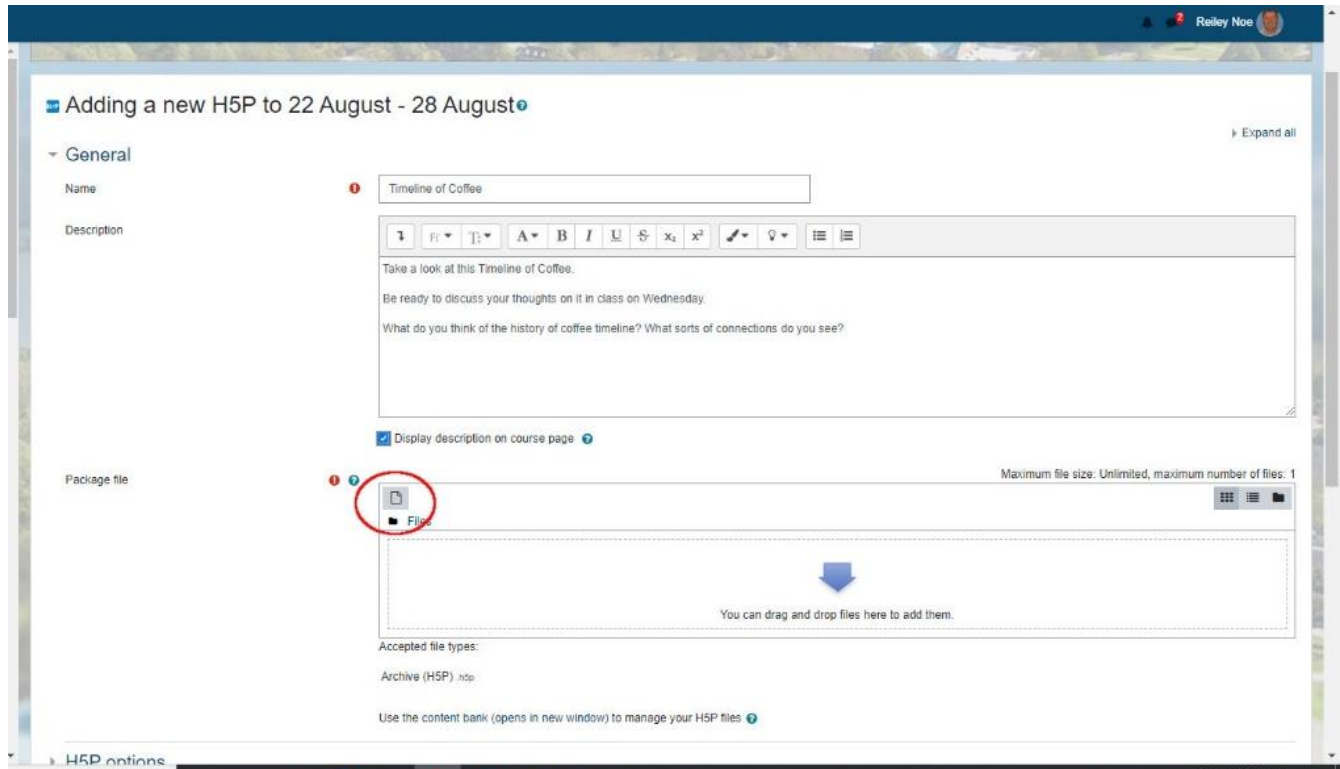
11. So you've created it, and it's in the **Content Bank** for this class. At some point, you'll want to deploy it onto your class. Click on **Add an Activity or Resource**.



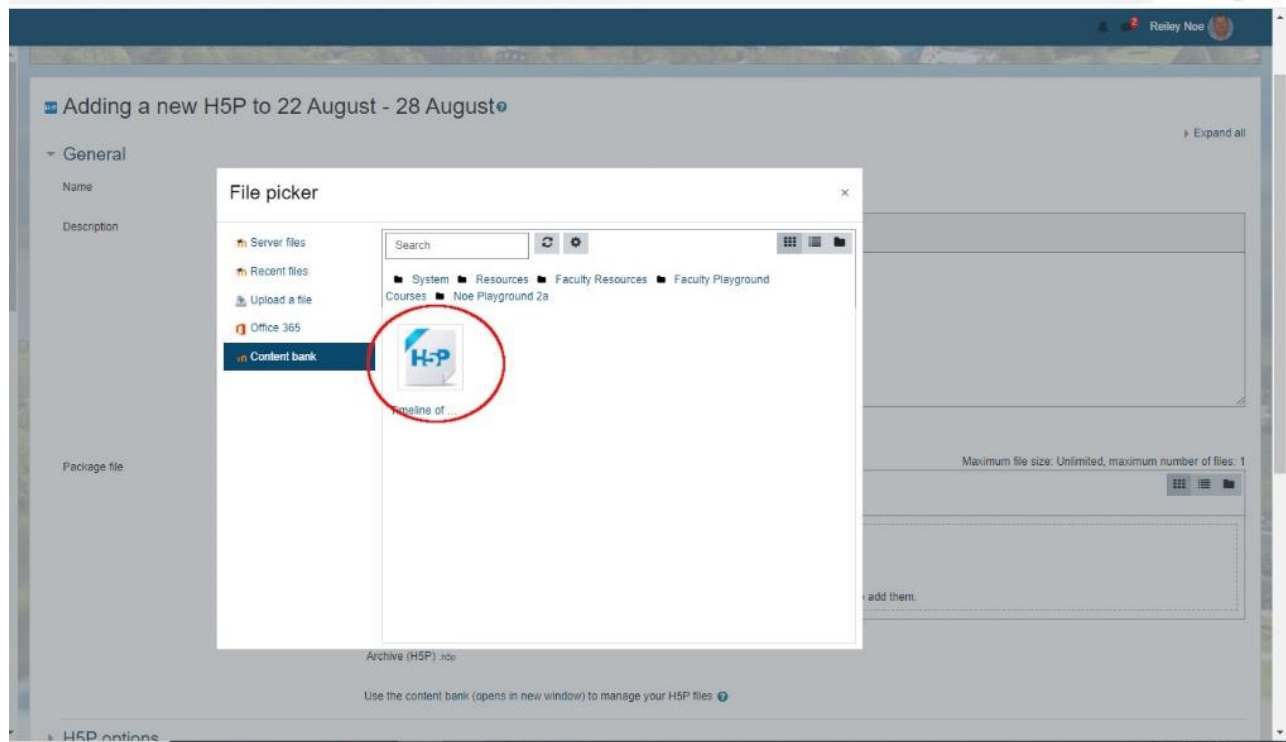
12. To move the item from the Content Bank to the course page, click on the **H5P icon** in the Activity Chooser



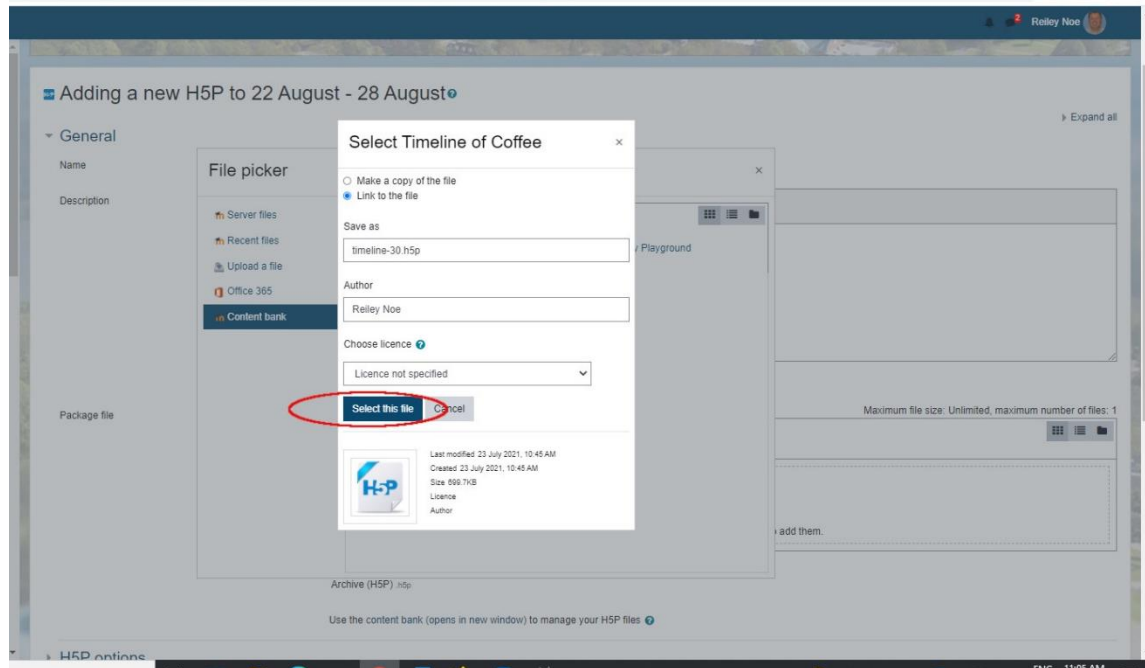
13. Give the H5P content item a name and you can give it a description for your course page. If you do so, click on the tick box below the description. Next click on the **dog-eared page icon** on the **File** area.



14. You'll see this page with the H5P content item – in this case, the **Timeline**.



15. This will link the file to your course. Click on the **Select this File** button.



16. Although a Timeline is not gradable, you'll still notice a few settings available, including – very confusingly – a grade link. If you were to adjust these settings, they would have no effect.

You can also add Activity Completion settings, though, if you would like to see who has finished the timeline.

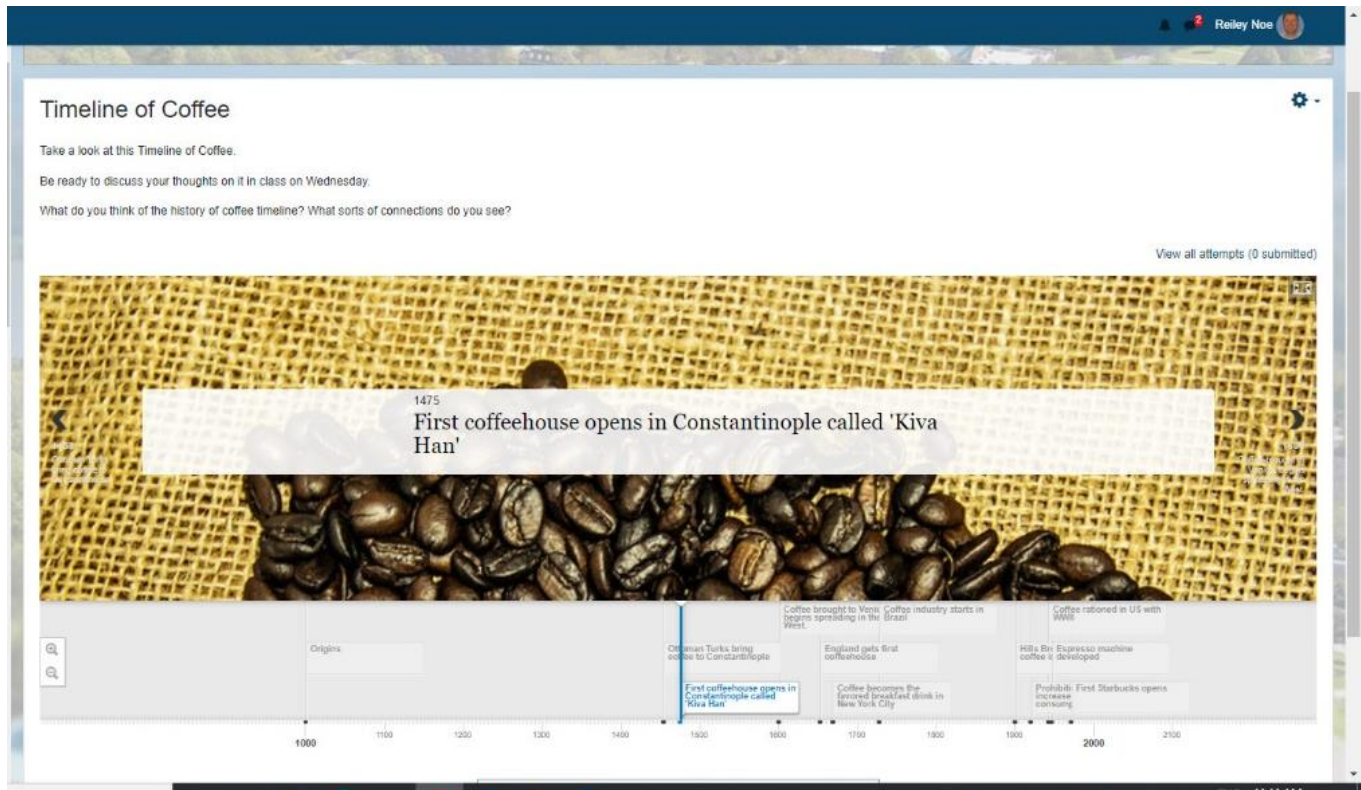

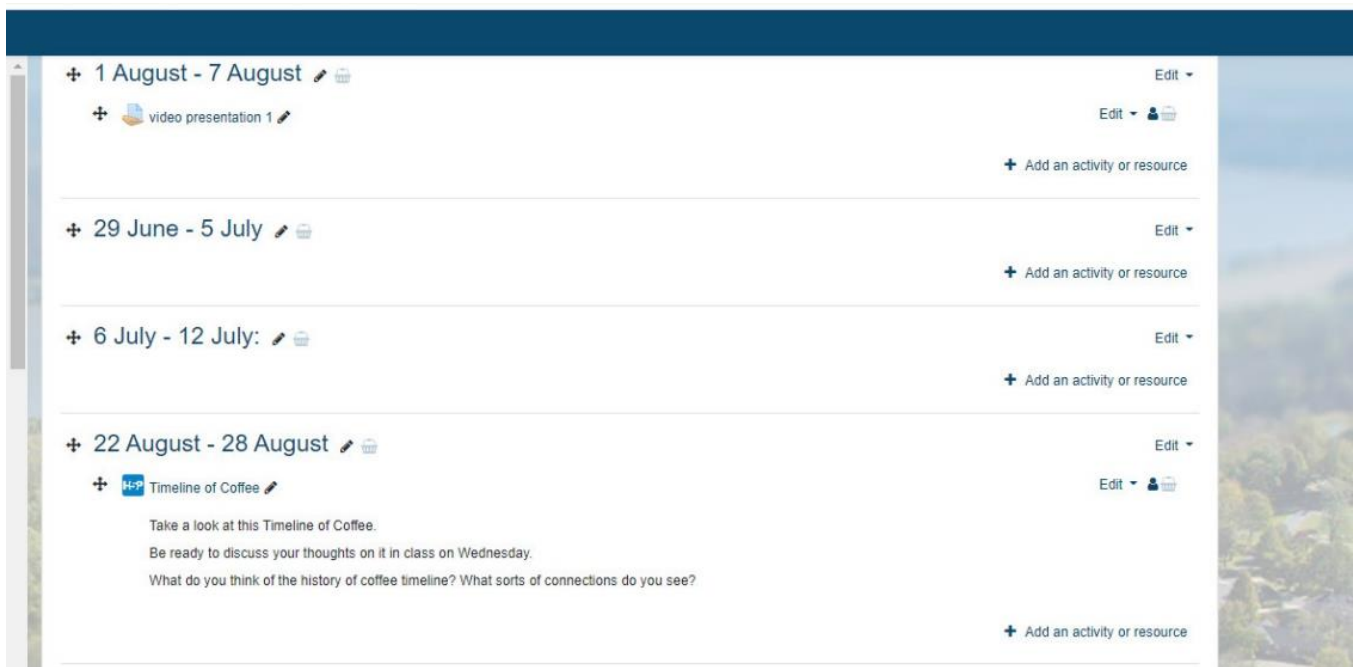

17. The Timeline will appear as a student would see it or use it. This is the history of coffee timeline that I created in the Content Bank. Students can click on a text bubble and it will move the timeline to there to help them better visualize the temporal relationships of different events.



18. This is what it looks like on a course page. Students would click on the link or the icon to access the timeline. I enabled my description onto the course page.



19. Whenever you create a content item in H5P – **whether or not it is gradable** – it will appear on your gradebook. You can go into the settings for the item on the course page and disable grading. Doing this will make the grade item disappear from the gradebook but still be on your course page. Here is how to do this.

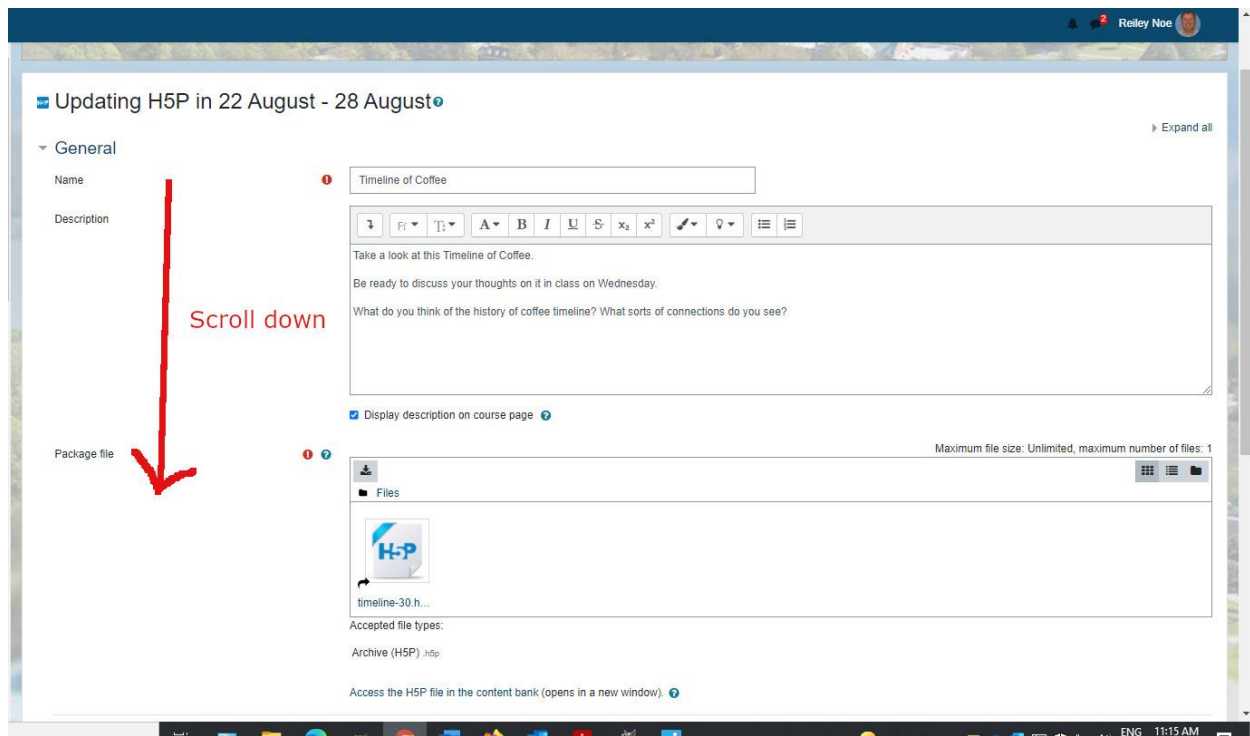

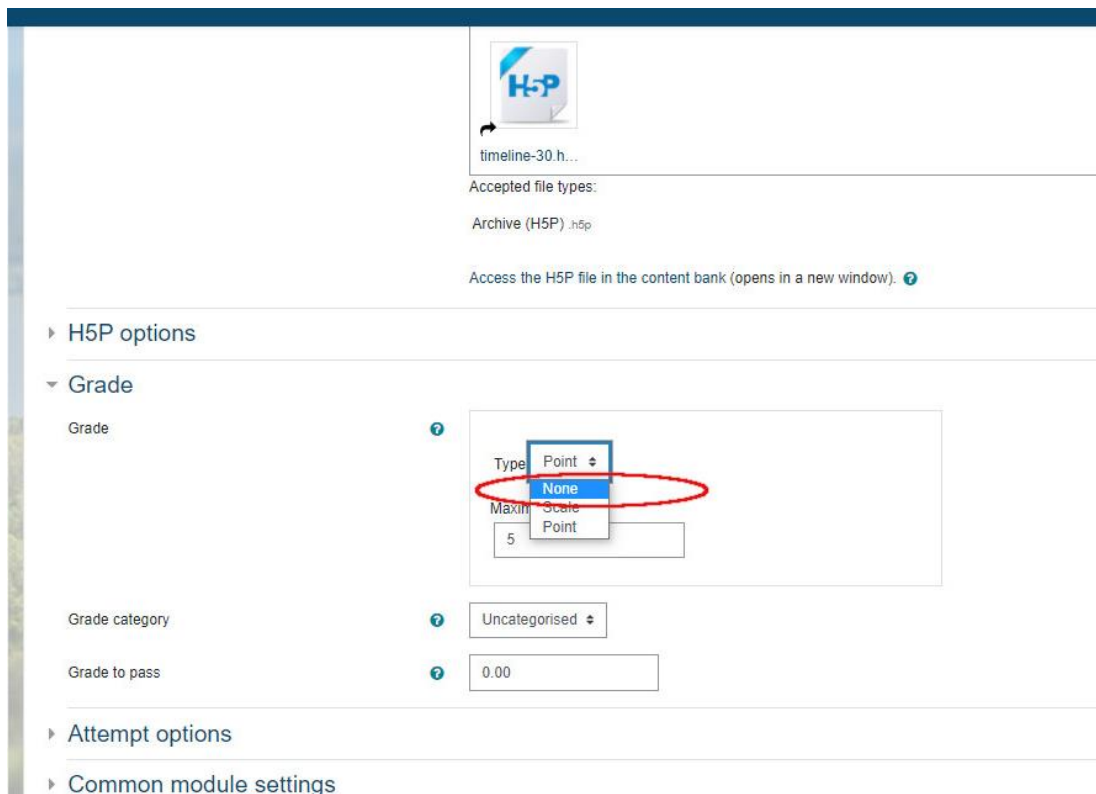


21. On the Settings page, scroll down.
