


Setting up lockdown browser:

1. Click on the Gear icon and Turn Editing On. Then click on the link for Edit across from the Quiz that you want to add to LockDown Browser. Click Edit Settings.




3. Click Show More. When the screen opens up, Change Browser Security from None to Browser Security Should be set through LockDown Browser Dashboard


4. Click on General to go to the front page of the class. Scroll down to the Respondus LockDown Browser block in the lower right. Click on the link for Dashboard.

5. Click the Continue to LockDown Browser button on the screen that pops up.




6. Find the Quiz you want the LockDownBrowser to appear on. Click the down arrow icon. It turns green. On the menu that appears, click settings.



7. Click on the radio button to Require Lockdown Browser and then click Save and Close.

The Respondus monitor is a different product aimed at online classes that will use the student's webcam to monitor for any potential cheating. You should not require this for your in-class exam.



8. You'll know it is set up correctly if "Required" appears in green.
